VI. Ralph Ford, Chancellor

<u>Enrollments:</u> This year's enrollment is 46 students down relative to last year. This decline is part of an ongoing trend. The numbers are up for in- and out- of state students. International student enrolment is down. Eastern campuses are doing better relative to western campuses. There is a steady growth on World campus.

<u>"Count me in" campaign:</u> Last year the whole campus contributed to the enrolment success. There is now an additional scholarship for the out of state students -- "Discover Penn State."

Two large residence halls are not filled – Tiffany and Perry. This is in line with the trends on other campuses.

<u>Annual Raise</u>: should have gone into effect in July. The maxim amount 2.5 % However, the board did not approve this till after July. The payments will be retrospective in October. Raise is based on the annual review. The additional .5 % are distributed at the discretion of the School director.

<u>Erie Hall:</u> The renovations are at the "schematic design phase." If you are interested in providing input, please attend the meetings. Erie Hall will close on May 1, 2020; the new building will be going up in September 2020. Construction should be completed in Spring of 2022.

Federal House: April 2020 - breaking ground. April 2021 -- opening.

<u>Strategic Plan:</u> Plan in coming to the end, it will be updated and continued into the future. Behrend will be updating the strategic plan. Ken Miller and Pam Silver are to lead the collection of constituent input for the updated strategic plan.

<u>"Vision of the Behrend Graduate"</u>: Developing a common understanding of the graduate for our campus. There have been some surveys last year, the statement has been developed and will be shared with the campus community to test it out with different constituents.

<u>"Open Laboratory"</u>: What does that mean? Viewing campus as open laboratory for the campus community and broader Erie community, ex CORE.

<u>Student Success</u>: How to make more of our students to graduate. The current number for Behrend are 70%; compared to national 60% graduation rate. The actions of the faculty have a great impact on helping students "make good choices" which might help with retention. Opportunity for enrolments in keeping our students at Behrend. Goal – retention for all four years of college.

- X. Ivor Knight, Associate Dean for Research and Graduate Studies This summer there were 40 undergraduate students working full time on research with faculty. Some were funded from the college; some were funded by grants. There was diversity of projects and interdisciplinary projects. The value of working with faculty on research is unique for Behrend, where it is easier dues to our size. We want to increase the opportunities for faculty/student research. Ivor and Ralph put in a proposal to the board to significantly increase the support for scholarly activity. The Board agreed to a \$600,000 yearly F&A for next five years to Behrend. These funds are for start-up projects, seed grants (the number of seed grants will be doubled this year), additional graduate students working on research, staff support for research implementation and grant writing. The big announcement on September 3 has do to with research.

Graduate numbers: The numbers are down 10%, but on world campus the enrollment in up, online MBA is the same relative to last year.

Regional learning alliance with Cranberry is doing well compared to the same program in Erie. The goal is to expand this programing.

This year there is elected graduate curriculum committee, for the first time in Behrend.

Undergraduate research support – deadline September 13 with grant decision should be made by late September and research starting mid-October.
