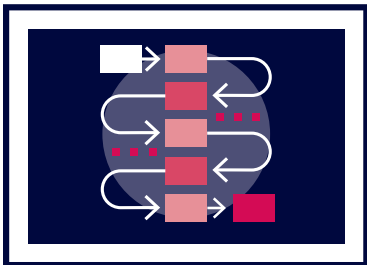




Why hire a Penn State Behrend Project and Supply Chain Management graduate?
