

CONDUCT STANDARDS AGREEMENT

Each student participating in an activity sponsored by the College that involves travel must read and agree to the terms of this document. You are not only representing yourself, but the College as well. Your behavior will influence the impressions that others have of Behrend College and Penn State.

Participants are expected to meet the following conduct standards for the duration of the trip. Students who fail to uphold these standards may be faced with any or all of the following consequences: sanctions imposed by the host institution, Penn State's Office of Judicial Affairs, and/or dismissal from the program. The decision to terminate a student's participation will be made by the Behrend College staff member coordinating the trip.

A student may be dismissed without warning or prior notice. If dismissed, neither Penn State nor the host institution is obligated to refund any part of the fees associated with participation.

1. Students are expected to maintain behavior consistent with Penn State's Code of Conduct (see Student Guide to University Policies and Rules).
2. Illegal possession, use or dissemination of illicit drugs is prohibited.
3. Abuse of alcohol is prohibited and may result in termination from the program.
4. Students must attend all mandatory field trips and activities unless excused by the on-site Penn State staff member.
5. Students who cause any damage to persons or property will be responsible for all costs and associated liability.
6. Where applicable, students must abide by all household rules as established by program coordinator.
7. Behavior deemed detrimental to yourself or others (including, but not limited to, sexual harassment) is cause for dismissal.

In the event of an emergency (i.e., illness or accident) or dismissal, the emergency contacts indicated on the *Emergency Contact & Health/Welfare Form* will be notified immediately.

I have read and understand the conduct standards outlined above. I agree to abide by these standards and accept disciplinary consequences if I fail to do so. I understand that a copy of this signed document will be kept in College files.
